

Out and About

Ed's note: My pleas for reviews of any of the many folk events which were around town in March fell on deaf ears – except for those of Alexa McLaughlan who has kindly sent me the following piece about Bruce Watson and his recent house concert in Gilmore. I have added some reviews of the *Mosaic* album from Bruce's website – www.brucewatsonmusic.com – from which you can order the CD.

Bruce Watson is what I call a real folkie. He crafts poignant and funny songs, performs them with charm and comes to many festivals whether he's being paid or not. I have especially enjoyed his poignant songs and performances for many years and have many of his albums.



Last year, Bruce crowd-funded his latest album, Mosaic. It was great to see our folk community support that. It's a delightful album, a real treasure.

Based in Melbourne, he and partner Jill are now roaming more often after retiring, to our benefit.

He graced a house concert at Gilmore on 11 March, relocated from Bungendore. I was grateful that the location was accessible and cheer for the hosts who also provided great musical support for the concert.

The audience was small, way less than Bruce deserved, but of high quality. The talks with Bruce and others as well as the food were truly nourishing.

In two brackets, Bruce brought tales and songs from his prolific collection, including historical and contemporary material. I enjoyed them all but my memory, as always, lets me down other than for *The Man and The Woman and the Edison Phonograph*.

Keep your eyes open for blackboard performances and the Sunday service at the National.

Mosaic is wonderful, I laughed, I choked up, I cried. This album has nailed it, excellent songs, cleverly crafted musicianship.
