

### What should I wear?

Dress comfortably! Bush dancing is great exercise, and it is a good workout, and so don't overdress. Even if it is cool you probably won't want to wear a jumper or long sleeves while dancing. Layers of clothing work well, just as in Cross-Country skiing. Women often enjoy dancing in a skirt, as skirts flow to the music. Casual shirts are common dress. Don't worry about what to wear – there is no special costume, just be comfortable. You probably will get warm as you dance.



## What about shoes?

Since we dance on hardwood floors, many people bring a separate pair of shoes from the ones they wear to the dance. Clean off any grit from outside that might be on the soles of your shoes and could damage the floor. If possible, it is

preferable not to dance in shoes with rubber soles, as these are harder on your joints – ankles, knees and hips in the long run. But people have danced in joggers, tennis shoes or whatever. The main thing is that your shoes are comfortable for you for active dancing. This normally means flat, comfortable shoes with smooth soles.

Camp over if you feel outdoorsy and cool off again in the Goodradigbee River or spring fed creeks.



## **Music with MFS**





## **Out and About**

# "Mission Songs" at the National Library by Declan O'Connell



I still remember the words I saw on a 1980s poster: "White Australia Has a Black History". You wouldn't always know that from the ballads about convicts, bushrangers, shearers and the like; apart from the odd reference to, say, the "native black lying there in ambush" who gave the tyrant Captain Logan his mortal stroke, to the delight of the prisoners in *Moreton Bay*.

2017 National Library National Folk Follow Jessie Lloyd's *Mission Songs Project* is setting all this to right, bringing Indigenous songs from the "Mission era" (1901-1967) back into circulation. The songs are not just from the Christian missions but also from Aboriginal reserves and town camps. As she explained in her wonderfully informative and entertaining lecture/concert at the National Library on Tuesday 21 November, she was initially inspired by a song she learned from her nan in Palm Island, *Down in the Kitchen*. She went on to track down "knowledge-carrying songs" from across Australia; songs characterised, she found, by hope, resilience and humour, songs which tell us so much about Australian history.

When the lecture morphed into a concert, Jessie was helped out on vocals by Deline Briscoe, Jessica Hitchcock and Emma Donovan. After Down in the Kitchen, the quartet sang Old Cape Barren (from Tasmania), Hopkins

River (from Framlingham, Victoria, a song Jessie got from Archie Roach, it was written by his grandmother's sister), Outcast Half Caste (collected by Chris Sullivan and written by Emma Donovan's nan and pop, Mary Deroux and Micko Donovan), Middle Camp (from Moree) and Surrare (from the Torres Strait). Jessie Lloyd's Mission Songs Project CD (and booklet) includes all these songs and more. It is worth tracking down. It'll make you re-think what the Australian folk tradition means.



# Nariel Creek Folk Festival

The Nariel Creek Folk Festival is a celebration of traditional folk music, song and dance and is held on the banks of the beautiful Nariel Creek in the Nariel Recreation Reserve. The event has been held since the early sixties, making it one of the longest running folk festivals in Australia. The artists are not paid, and the event is a not-for-profit community event. Experience musical performances around the campfire and attend the blackboard concert on New Year's Day. There will also be a series of old time dances held in the Cudgewa Hall. The Festival is a great family-friendly event for those wanting something a little more laid-back and relaxed to enjoy over the festive period. Camping is available leading up to, during and after the festival. Fees apply.
