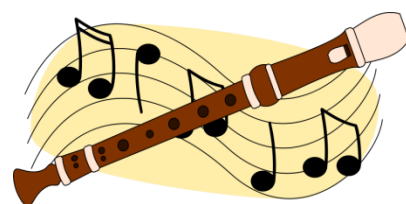

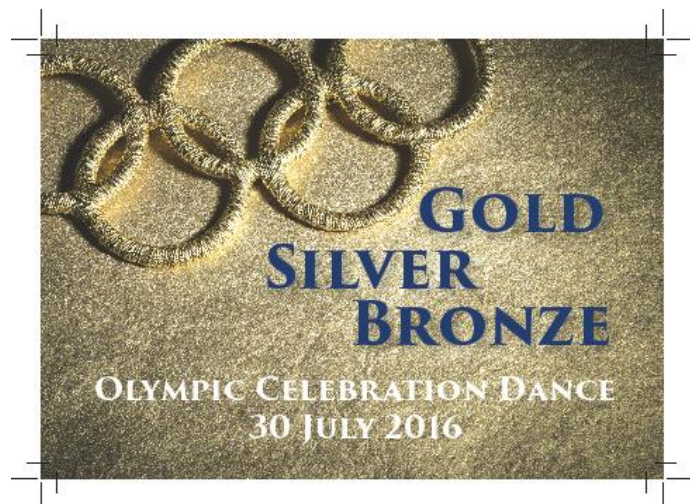

A Great Concert at the Irish Club (Review)



Connor Hoy, Donal O'Connor, John McSherry and Robert Leslie Hillman

John McSherry played the Irish Uilleann Pipes and Low D Whistle with faultless tone, gracefully gliding effortlessly through jigs, reels and slow airs with defined moments of brilliance that had the crowd whooping.

Donal's dynamic fiddle playing – a combination of warm rich depth and intense haste – was conveyed with unwavering accomplishment and unparalleled passion for the tradition. His witty personable stage banter lightened the scholarly superior mood set by the music, allowing for a relaxed feel.

Together they are the epitome of Northern Irish traditional music with suburb interpretations and arrangements.

Robert Hillman's guitar accompaniment and songs were inspiring, marrying the traditional with the contemporary
Overall a fabulous night... as one might expect with these guys at the helm.

An enthusiastic full house enjoyed a night of traditional Irish music from Northern Ireland's John McSherry and Donal O'Connor, with Robert Leslie Hillman from Melbourne at the Canberra Irish Club on Saturday 18 June.

Canberra's Dave O'Neill opened the night with a solo set of Irish and American songs and beautiful instrumental tunes.

Adelaide's Connor Hoy, the National Irish Dancing champion, provided an unexpected treat.

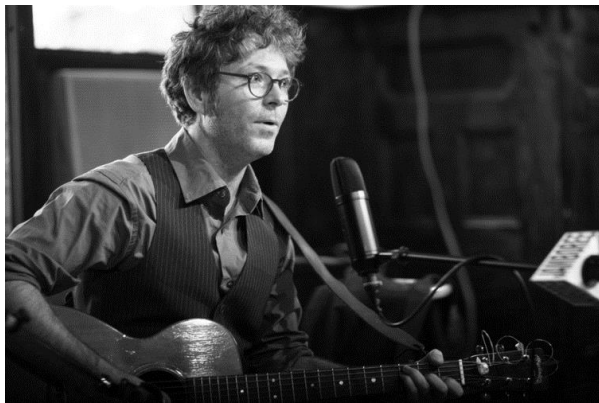


Sunday 10th July Blackboard plus Feature Act Vincent Cross
