

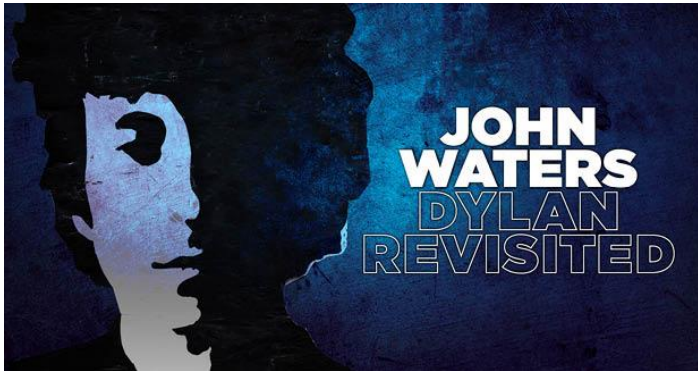

From the President's Soapbox

After many months of trying, we finally found an evening that suited almost everyone for another Organisers' Consultation. It was well attended, with 14 subgroup organisers and committee members discussing issues that affect the society in general. Proceedings will soon be up in the members' section of the website.

One of the items was publicity and our attempts to promote our activities to the general public, such as at the National Folk festival, CAP Expo, and various annual Heritage events. It was felt that many possibilities are overlooked because, while each group does what it can to publicise its own activities, we do not have a promotions officer to coordinate these efforts. The reason it is difficult to find people to take on such positions (Promotion, Musings Editor, Merry Muse coordinator) seems to be a fear of being lumped with a huge job with an open-ended commitment: a black hole that will swallow up their whole life.

Personally, I think it far more useful to consider having small groups of three or four people to spread the initial load of coordination. This then becomes more of a social meeting over coffee to discuss what could/needs to be done, and then find individuals to take on specific tasks: people are often happy to assist, but want tasks to be defined in scope and time commitment. I have already had offers of input to such a group, so if you are interested in being a part of it, please email me president@monarofolk.org.au. The more, the merrier.

Some members raised some concerns that current dance practices could be improved. As these issues did not relate to all groups it was decided to schedule a more specific meeting to allow enough time to discuss them. This meeting was duly held with 17 people attending, all MFS dance groups having members present, but with others

also coming to share information about protocols in other dance groups. It was a good meeting with a number of agreed outcomes, including the establishment of a working group to formulate practical solutions: these will then be circulated to interested parties. We have set up a new email address – if you have any concerns, complaints or suggestions, please give us input towards this process. Your email will be treated totally confidentially if you so wish. dancersfeedback@monarofolk.org.au

Another item was the MFS 50th anniversary which will occur in 2020. We discussed the possibility of a celebration similar to the one we held for the 45th anniversary in 2015 at the Yarralumla Woolshed. We will establish a working group – and any participation in this, or any thoughts/ideas from members on this are most welcome.

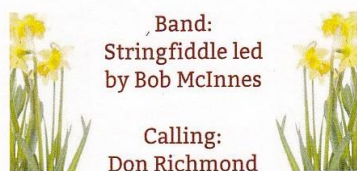

At the tail end of 2017 a small group of keen singers took it upon themselves to set sail on a journey of music, community and rousing good fun. Sea shanties were working songs for sailors, and the group set to work recruiting a crew. Now, less than two years later, the Canberra Shanty Club runs sessions which attract a diverse group - old and young, women and men, landlubbers and seafarers - to sing, stomp their feet and generally have a lot of fun.

With regular crowds of up to 40 people attending each shanty session, the structure is such that even first-timers with no idea of the words or tunes will end the night having joined in the choruses and call-and-response-sections of every song.

While some singers have a history with choirs and singing groups, others have no experience at all. Whatever your singing experience - once the song begins and the voices swell everybody finds a way to contribute.

Canberra Shanty Club is a supportive and friendly environment, welcoming to all. With blackboard appearances at the 2019 National Folk Festival and hosted singing sessions at the Bush Traditions Gathering 2018 under their belt, the club is now spreading their shanty singing to more festivals and venues, and spreading the rollicking good times far and wide.
