#### GALA ANNIVERSARY BALL – Saturday 7th March



The Gala Anniversary Ball, will take place on Saturday March 7th at the Albert Hall, doors open at 6.30pm, with dancing starting at 7pm. This event is a double celebration, as it marks the start of the MFS 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebrations, as well as the 30th Wedding Anniversary of regular dancers Roni and Adrian Giacobetti, who instigated this year's event. All dancers are invited to this very special double celebration.

Entry is just \$20 (an absolute bargain for any dance at Albert Hall) with a "bring a plate" supper after

## Bush Capital Band at Cooma Fundraiser

#### Bush Fire Fundraising Dance, Cooma – held on Saturday, 15th February



The MFS was invited to contribute dance callers and musicians to assist the Cooma Baptist Church run a fund raiser to acknowledge the heroic work done by the RFS, SES and volunteers, and to help restoration of wildlife in the area.

Eleven musicians, supported by Colin and Peter calling the dances, put on a show which greatly exceeded the locals' expectations. And some dancers from Canberra also travelled down. The audience were fantastic, enthusiastic and over half were aged below 25.

I believe that the door take and raffle/auction raised nearly \$3,000 to be split equally between the local RFS and LAOKO (the local wildlife rescue group).

To make the evening special, I suggested that Peter and I chose, or re-purposed, well known dances with appropriate pantomiming/actions - some of which I'd like to share with you:

"Gateway to the Snow" is Circassian Circle with dancers going in and out using skiing or snow boarding actions. Swings are the cable car winches, and promenade back to the chalet.

"Bob Sled" is Bridge of Athlone with line of competitors forward and back 'good to meet you' followed by 'hope you don't win'. The Head couples waves the start flag and rush to the bottom of the set, and the others holding waist in front cast their bob sled down to the bottom and through the finish flags waved by the original Head couple.

"Fire!" is Troika with lines upwards and back shouting "Fire" instead of "Oi". The middle person acting as a kangaroo, wombat, cockatoo weaves figure 8s around the outside 2 who stand as trees. Then circle as a fire hose, whooshing the fire out as you stamp.

Those of you who attended the Bush Dance in October 2019 run by MFS as a fund raiser for the Special Olympics will recognise some of the original ideas. I have to say I had so much fun dreaming up these reboots, and encourage others to give it a go.

Thanks to all who travelled to Cooma, and to Dave for coordinating the communications. And any ideas for other fund raising events willingly considered.

#### Canberra Greek Group at The Hellenic Club om March 22<sup>nd</sup>.




'The Canberra launch for *Domestic* last night was really lovely. Many thanks to those of you who ventured out and made us feel soooo supported!!!

'Fred Smith is simply the best folk/country musician working in this country in 2020. Beyond writing some of the finest songs about Australians at war (*Dust of Uruzgan*), he's created a repertoire that is

wry, literate, witty, powerfully emotional and insightful. On this remarkable album – with his palette impressively broad in both lyrical and musical stylings – he ranges through country, folk and faux-cabaret. He includes suitably sharp and savage commentary on our recent political history (Musical Chairs) where, hilariously, he rhymes "prime ministerial" with "venereal"; a haunting duet with Liz Frencham, Four Strong Hands, about the hardship of rural life during drought where men are suicidal and women are caring and rock-solid in their love; and a quasi-rockabilly backing for an amusing satire on modern life in Sydney (Brand New Page). But at the album's heart lies a stunning cycle of deeply personal songs about marriage, babies, love, tolerance, decency and the complexity of modern life (Maryanne, Turn Around, There I Go,



Staying Up Late, Beautiful Girl, Certain Things). A sublime study in tenderness and vulnerability.
