

If you listen to Community Radio 2XX (FM 98.3) you might be interested in hearing Jane O'Donohue presenting interviews with performers from the National over the next few months on *Lark in the Morning* which airs from 8.00 to 10.00 am on Sunday mornings. The next one is with Irish Mythen who seems to be a hit wherever she goes and it's on Sunday 26th May at 9.00 am. *Lark in the Morning* has been airing for about as long as 2XX has existed and is hosted by different presenters on different weeks of the month. You can also hear *Making Waves*, which now also includes some Country Music from 6.00 to 7.00 am from Tuesday to Friday and *The Folk Show* from Adelaide in the same time slot on Mondays. Saturday has *Rebel Chorus* (subtitled songs of Struggle, Sedition. Solidarity and Survival) on Saturdays from 10.00 am to 12.00 noon – the two main presenters are MFS's own Pete West and Declan O'Connell who are both extremely knowledgeable folkies and create interesting and enjoyable programmes.
