The Shiny Bums will pay tribute to our dear friend, Kerry, by performing our favourites of the many parodies he wrote or co-wrote for the group.



A legend slipped into Canberra for a gig at Llewellyn Hall on 25 September. I didn't see much publicity about Kris Kristofferson coming to town. I can't remember where I heard about the show. Facebook maybe. Anyway I was glad to catch it. Some Kristofferson songs have been part of the soundtrack of my life since the 1970s. He's 83 now and his voice is a bit croakier than it was on 1970s albums like *Kristofferson* and *The Silver Tongued Devil and I* but that didn't matter. Right from the get go he had an appreciative audience for his songs of lovers, losers, loners, drifters, dreamers and drunkards. He even had us whoopin' and hollerin' along at times. And we got all those 70s classics: Me and Bobby McGee (I used to know all the words), Sunday Mornin' Comin' Down, Darby's Castle etc. There was poignancy, too, in the opening number, Shipwrecked in the Eighties (Singing Holy Toledo I can't see the light anymore/All those horizon that I used to guide me are gone/And the darkness is driving me farther away from the shore/Throw me a rhyme or a reason to try to go on) and Feeling Mortal.



Kristofferson had Merle Haggard's band, The Strangers, backing him on keyboards, drum kit and fiddle, so we had some Merle Haggard songs as well including An Okie from Muskogee (somewhat tongue-in-cheek, I think), Daddy Frank (The Guitar Man) and I Think I'll Just Stay Here and Drink. Not much talk between songs, no encore (he didn't need one he'd got into the show-stoppers earl,. A happy crowd stepped out into the Canberra cold to make their way home, glad they'd seen a legend and heard his greatest hits.

Festival of Irish and Celtic Music, Yass NSW, 13-15 September 2019 by Pete West

This year's Festival of Irish and Celtic Music in Yass was well managed and had a beaut program of entertaining performers, and didn't they turn on the beautiful weather for the weekend. Our festival director Janno Scanes really knows how to pull some strings.

Mary Martin and I hosted the Beginners' Harmonica Workshop at the festival again this year, which we've done now for three years. This year's workshop was attended by about 25 persons, a much more manageable number than the 44 who turned up to the workshop last year! This time we were helped by our friends Jeffery Brown who plays chromonica and Peter Russell who sang for us.

The tune we used as our learning piece was that of the Foggy Dew, a patriotic Irish song from the Easter Rising in Dublin. And for play-along experience we used Ulick O'Boyle's lovely song Jindabyne Farewell that Peter sang beautifully for us. They were a musical crowd and they encouraged one another well, and by the end of the workshop session they were able to play along together on both pieces, some even had mastered single note playing and the others were playing chords. From our viewpoint the workshop was a hoot. Jeff hosted an advanced harmonica workshop after our beginners' one. It was attended by about ten players.



Among the performers whose acts we saw, we most enjoyed the excellent concert by Suzette Herft that celebrated the songs of Joan Baez. We agreed with other patrons after the show who described it as "brilliant". We also greatly enjoyed the performance by South Coast band The Water Runners whose bluegrass influenced playing was tight and well rehearsed. They had some very good songs and we particularly enjoyed the playing of the group's fiddler.

At the Club House venue, we enjoyed several good acts among which we thought the Sweet Sorrows was outstanding. A big thanks to Rick Saur for his great sound management of the Club House stage, not the easiest venue from the sound viewpoint.

The festival committee, the local business people and the townsfolk all made us feel very welcome. We're sending a special nod to the friendly staff of the Liberty Cafe & the Club House Hotel where we stayed. Congratulations and thanks to all involved.

Four days of traditional Australian music, dance, poetry, songs and general good fun.

The Gathering happened in Yass over the weekend just past. The feed back has been one of superlatives and satisfaction. The Gathering works like a convention. There was much to do, much to be part of. The atmosphere can be characterised as warm, friendly, sharing, informal. There were sessions, some slow, some faster and some pretty.

Rob Willis and John Harpley spoke of their interviews with Bill Case, and played snippets of their recording. These recording are available in full from the National Library of Australia.

Marion Haig brought us some poems of John O'Brien, put to song by Dom Moreno. There was shanty singing, and a workshop lead by Dave Johnson featuring songs found in Trove.

This year we placed a focus on crafts. This worked well with intriguing displays of skills and technique in the production of hats made from cabbage tree fibres, silk and wool threads dyed intense colours of yellow, orange, russet and various greys using eucalyptus leaves and various mordants.
