

Tuesday Night Music Group (TiNMuGs) Report

The Tuesday Night Music Group (TiNMuGs for short) saw another very successful and enjoyable year of music making. This group of intrepid musician meets every Tuesday, come rain or shine, based at the Canberra Irish Club but also occasionally meeting at someone's house or LDK Tuggeranong. Numbers have been steadily growing, with new members being referred by word of mouth and also by enquiries from the MFS Website.

While sessions are fun, playing for special events is particularly enjoyable and the growing reputation of the TiNMuGs has seen us invited back year after year for regular events such as Spiral, Probus and other clubs and the annual harvest bush dance at Guys Cross Olive Farm.

The TiNMuGs welcomes a wide range of instruments, which at times has included a hollow log bush bass, a hurdy gurdy and even a banjo! The group provides a welcoming environment for all skill levels; enjoyable sessions in which beginners can progress and experienced players can learn a new instrument while being supported by a good number of more experienced players. The pace is moderate, although a few brisk sets may occasionally be thrown in.
