



From the President's Soapbox

Over the past year we have been building a good cooperative relationship with the Irish Club at Weston. This began with the Tuesday Night Music Group holding sessions there as well as a number of committee and subgroup organisers' meetings being held there. They generously offered the use of their auditorium for the August Merry Muse on short notice. As a result it has been decided to make The Irish Club our regular home for the Merry Muse (this happy arrangement having been negotiated by Eileen) so we hope our members will come and enjoy the warm and welcoming atmosphere there.

The new Poets Group made its presence felt at the last Merry Muse in a blackboard program that intertwined music and poems as well as the launch of John Walker's book. It was a most successful union that may well lead to a new generation of wee songs and little limericks so the Poets will be ongoing participants at the Muse. It has been suggested that a likely name for them would be The Gilded Poets (as in "there were some gilded youths that sat along the barber's wall"). However any thoughts on a different name may be welcomed by them.

Don't forget the Turning Wave Festival is happening this month in Yass from Friday 16 to Sunday 18. MFS is supporting the festival with sessions, workshops and the Bush Capital Band playing for the Colonial Bush Dance on Saturday night so put that into your calendar.

Finally the AGM is the occasion for voting for the 2016-17 Committee and new candidates are always welcome. The duties are not onerous and it is an opportunity for you to be a part of developing initiatives in your society. Hoping to see you there.

MFS happenings past and to come

Bush Dance Classes on Mondays continue until September 19th. There are public holidays on the last Monday of September and the first one in October so classes recommence on October 10th. Our regular callers, Daryl, Peter and Mark will lead dancers through the basics and finer points of dancing, while providing a varied and interesting selection of dances. These classes are a great entry point for learning to dance as we cover all manner of dance formations, square sets, longways sets, circle dances, etc, as well as some of the different dance steps like waltzes, polkas and schottisches. Many of the Monday night dancers have also gone on to take up Contra, English Country and Irish dancing as these all have moves and steps in common with bush dancing.

Monday night classes are held at All Saints Church Hall, Cowper Street Ainslie, from 8.00 to 10.00 pm and the cost is still only \$6 for MFS members. A great place to introduce your friends to the wonderful world of dance - new dancers receive their 2nd night free.

The **2nd Saturday Bush Dance** will happen on September 10th at All Saints Church Hall. Please note there is a new starting time of 7.00 pm, and consequently the dance will finish at 10.30 pm. Prices are down too – only \$10 for MFS members and \$1 for a bottomless cup of hot or cold drink. Supper plates welcomed.

As always, all dances are taught and called, so everyone can come along and have a great night of dancing. We'll do many of the dances that have been taught in detail on Mondays so some of you will be familiar with these. Live music from the Bush Capital Band.

This music can be characterized as dance music brought to Australia by the many peoples who came here to settle over the past 200 years. The music derives from Europe, predominantly from Britain and Scandinavia, but it originates from wherever immigrants came from. Once here the music moved through whole communities, each influencing the other, changing it in ways that reflect life in Australia. It has its own style; relaxed, laconic and pretty.

Over the past 70 years some notable and dedicated people have recorded interviews covering many thousands of hours with singers, musicians and dancers who spoke of what it was like to live their lives in communities across Australia. The result is an oral record covering the past 150 years. The National Library of Australia holds over 50 000 hours of this material. The Settlers Group provides a way of accessing this music. It is an opportunity to engage with a living tradition, to learn and play some of this music.

Instruments tend to be acoustic in nature; accordion, bass guitar, fiddle, flute, guitar, mandolin, piano, whistle etc.

Contra for September happens on Tuesday the 6th and Tuesday 20th from 7.30 to 9.30 pm at North Canberra Baptist Church Hall, 17 Condamine Street, Turner with live music from Contraband. \$6 for MFS members and \$8 for others.



The Merry Muse goes Poetical!

The Merry Muse whiteboard session at the Irish Club in Weston on 14th August featured the launch of John Walker's poetry book, "the Loaded Doggerel – memoirs of a Ten-Pound Pom 40 years on". Perhaps appropriately (considering the venue) channelling Irish comedian Dave Allen, John performed from a comfy chair, with a glass of Guinness in one hand, and with the startled look of a first-time performer alone onstage under the spotlights. His poems covered his origins in the English manufacturing city of Coventry (where our Aussie phrase "True Blue" came from – did you know that?), the journey to, and arrival in, Australia (welcome to "Woo-Loo-Moo-Loo" – have a pint of schooner!), and a range of almost-credible experiences of living in the Canberra-Queanbeyan region. Tales of his (fictitious) great granddad's phenomenal sporting prowess, and his (also fictitious) Aunt Elsie and Uncle Cyril amused the audience, while some may have been surprised by the consequences of Polish former Pope John Paul II's difficulty in distinguishing between Pole-dancing and Polish dancing. Jim was Secretary and twice President of the FAA, and organised insurance matters for the FAA for many years.

Jim's drive and passion for encouraging and supporting artists as they made their way in the scene has made a significant difference to too many young artists to mention. The endless time spent sharing his knowledge with others in areas such as touring/agency work, house concerts, and festivals was a testament to his generosity and passion for supporting the business of Folk.
